Find and Replace Text Batch Process

Sometimes you have to replace some text/notes etc. with updated text/notes across many files, the Batch Processing tool can do this but you need to know the command syntax to be able to use it. Below is an example that can be cut and pasted into the script file, just replace the highlighted text with your text strings. If you have multiple text or notes to be edited in the files, just copy the line of code to the next one down (as shown) and edit the text strings accordingly, do the same for each different text/note to be edited.

Copy and paste the code below to a text file and save it in \$(_USTN_ORGANIZATION)data/, \$(_USTN_WORKSPACESTANDARDS)Data/, or \$(_USTN_WORKSETSTANDARDS)Data/ folder ready to be used with the Batch Processing tool.
